| Students who are not TSI-compliant in reading or English are advised to take the INRW0300/ENGL1301 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in these areas and college-credit for ENGL1301. ENGL1302 requires a 'C' or better in the corequisite or approval by the English Chairperson. Students who are not TSI-compliant in math are advised to take the MATH0332/MATH1332 or MATH0314/MATH1314 corequisite. Successful completion will grant TSI-compliance in math and college-credit. | | | |
| ENMU Applicable Transfer Credit Hours | | | |
| Evaluation of course credit earned at other institutions does not ensure approval of the credit for use toward specific degree requirements. Transferred courses completed may be applied to fulfill course requirements in majors, minors, or concentrations. Applicants must submit official transcripts from all accredited institutions attended. All college-level, courses completed with a passing grade of D or above at regionally accredited colleges and universities (not including trade or technical schools) will be evaluated for acceptance of academic transfer credit. Students who complete Associate of Art or Associate of Science degrees at SPC are considered to be "Gen Ed Complete" at ENMU. Students completing Associate of Applied Science degrees may need additional general education requirements. ENMU strongly recommends that all SPC transfer students complete the equivalent of the A.A. or A.S. general education requirements in full at SPC prior to transferring. Vocational or technical credits are also evaluated but may be applied only to Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (B.A.A.S.) or Bachelor of Career and Technical Education (B.C.T.E.) degrees. Developmental coursework is not applied to any degree. ENMU determines acceptable transfer credit on the basis of an evaluation of course content as described from the sending institution's catalog and in consultation with the appropriate academic units at Eastern New Mexico University as necessary for clarification. While all credit hours presented on the sending institution's transcripts will be evaluated and equivalent college level courses posted to the | | | |

student's academic record. Courses that are accepted for transfer do not necessarily apply toward college, departmental, or program degree requirements. Those courses may count as elective credit and may impact financial aid limits. To meet ENMU residency requirements, students must complete at least 30 hours, taken from coursework at ENMU Portales's campus. Those 30 hours must also be taken during the last 60 hours toward the ENMU degree.

Using this Transfer Advising Guide with ENMU

This Transfer Advising Guide represents the SPC coursework and alerts students to equivalent ENMU courses offered through the lower-level of credits required of a bachelor's degree and is subject to change at the university's discretion. It is intended for advising purposes only so students know exactly which courses they can take at South Plains College and have the courses count towards degree requirements when they transfer to ENMU. It is highly recommended that students meet with their assigned academic advisor to review all graduation and transfer requirements listed in the Transfer Advising Guide.

The ultimate goal is to provide students with accurate information for transfer pathways while minimizing loss of credits in transfer. Students are encouraged to review ENMU's requirements frequently.

The Transfer Advising Guide is based upon [ENMU's catalog](#) and is subject to change.

Texas 135-Mile Tuition Waiver

Amount: waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition

Eligibility: live within 135 miles of ENMU-Portales, renewal is automatic and is not based on GPA or number of hours taken.

Application deadline: there is no application required for this waiver, it will be automatically applied to your account if you meet the eligibility requirements.

Scholarships

Scholarships are awarded by Enrollment Services, the [ENMU Foundation](#) and various academic departments to current and incoming students. The [Office of Financial Aid](#) administers these funds after they have been awarded.

Transfer Academic Scholarship

Amount: \$200-\$700 per academic year

Application deadline: for priority consideration, apply by Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Applications may be considered until two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester. In order for us to be able to process your scholarship application, you should [apply for admission](#) first, because you won't be eligible to receive an Admissions Scholarship until you are admitted to ENMU.

Eligibility: have a 3.5 or higher cumulative college GPA

Continuation: may be awarded up to four consecutive semesters or receipt of degree (whichever comes first) if you complete at least 15 hours with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

Amount: in-state: \$450 per semester; Out-of-state: \$450 per semester, plus a waiver of the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition. Only a limited number of these scholarships are awarded.

Eligibility:

- Be a Phi Theta Kappa member with a 3.5 cumulative college GPA, who has earned an associate degree or minimum of 60 hours of college credit.
- Proof of Phi Theta Kappa membership is required. Please provide a copy of your membership card.

Application deadline: for priority consideration, apply by Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Applications may be considered until two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester. In order for us to be able to process your scholarship application, you should [apply for admission](#) first, because you won't be eligible to receive an Admissions Scholarship until you are admitted to ENMU.

May be awarded up to four consecutive semesters or receipt of degree (whichever comes first) if you complete at least 15 hours with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher.

Transfer Competitive Waiver

Amount: waives the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition (Colorado Scholar and Texas 135-Mile scholarships awarded separately, see below.)

Application deadline: for priority consideration, apply by Aug. 1 for fall and Jan. 3 for spring. Applications may be considered until two weeks prior to the beginning of the semester. In order for us to be able to process your scholarship application, you should [apply for admission](#) first, because you won't be eligible to receive an Admissions Scholarship until you are admitted to ENMU.

Eligibility: Meet one of the following requirements:

- 3.5 cumulative college GPA
- 3.0 cumulative high school GPA and a 23 ACT or 1060 SAT score (national test)
- 3.5 cumulative high school GPA and a 20 ACT or 940 SAT score (national test)

Continuation: may be awarded up to four consecutive semesters or receipt of degree (whichever comes first) if you complete at least 12 hours with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.

ENMU Foundation Scholarships
